Swindon Museum and Art Gallery

Swindon Museum and Art Gallery is the home of the internationally important Swindon Collection, which contains works by some of the most significant British artists of the twentieth century, including Henry Moore, L.S. Lowry, Lucian Freud, Ben Nicholson, Richard Hamilton and Gillian Ayres. The art collection is paralleled by a collection of studio ceramics including works by Lucie Rie, Hans Coper and David Leach.

The Museum is part of Swindon Borough Council. It is accredited as a museum by the Arts Council of England, which means that it is the co-ordinating body for all archaeological projects within the area.

In 1930 the Museum moved to Apsley House, its current home, to house the collections of Charles Gore who for many years was the honorary curator. It is a local studies museum and features in its collection items relating to the story of Swindon over the last 250 million years, with fossils from local Old Town quarries. Displays include items from the Neolithic period through Roman, Saxon, and mediaeval times to the present day. Two of the most impressive objects are the Roman glass funerary urn from Purton, unbroken after 1700 years in the ground, and the Highworth Pot, a large earthenware container broken 1700 years ago and then mended by the Romans with lead staples. The most popular exhibits are 'The Croc', a three-metre-long Indian Gharial (one of the ten most endangered species in the world) and the Egyptian mummy, a boy called Hatemiu.
